There is NO Secure Way to Post Videos or Photos of Protestors on Social Media

- * Not backs of heads**
- * Not crowd shots**
- * Not drone videos**
- * Not emojis on faces**
- * Not blurring images**



...But What If No One is Doing Anything “Illegal” in Your Image?

- * Images and Videos taken throughout an event are used to connect the dots and identify protestors**
- * Posting Protestors on Social Media puts them at risk to be identified and targeted by:**
 - Police, ICE, FBI, Other White Supremacist groups**



...But What If It's Just Me in the Photograph?

- * Regardless, the image's metadata and its background information can be used to target you and other protestors.**
- * Even partial images of small items like a sneaker or a backpack can be used to track and target a protestor for criminalization and other forms of state and interpersonal violence.**

Protest Photos and Video are a Powerful Way to Document Police Violence, Including Arrest

- * DO NOT post these images on social media; instead, connect with jail support, medics, and legal support. When possible, offer to securely share images with a person who was arrested.**
